Introduction

Ninety-one years ago, Pope Pius1x the set aside this day Mission Sunday so that every diocese, Parish, religious community association throughout the world would pray for and make a collection for the Christian communities in need and also support missionaries in proclaiming the Gospel to the ends of the earth. Missionaries have brought education, health care and the fight for social justice to almost every country, we can think of.
